Components



1 Box base with insert



16 Stickers



1 Wreath (5 pieces)



1 Gameboard



24 Dino Eggs
(6 Eggs each in 4 colors)



4 Dino Wands



76 Dino Baby counters
(19 Eggs each in 4 colors)



1 Dori marker

Before the first game

Carefully detach all the parts from the punchboards.



Prepare the insert. Each compartment is marked on the bottom with a letter. Attach the stickers into the matching compartments according to the letters. Use the large stickers on the bottom and the small ones on the edge.

Assemble the Wreath as shown. Once assembled, the Wreath can be stored in the insert after the game.

Game Setup



1. Take all game components out of the box. Place the gameboard on the insert and place the box in the middle of the table within easy reach of all players. Make sure everyone is about the same distance from the box, depending on your arm length.
2. Place the Wreath in the middle of the gameboard and fill it with all the Dino Eggs. Then carefully remove the Wreath so that the Dino Eggs remain in the middle and then set the Wreath aside.
3. Now everyone takes a Dino Wand.
4. Place the Dino Baby counters next to the box.
5. The youngest player takes the Dori marker and places it in front of them.

Game Play

Oh dear! All the Dino Eggs have fallen out of the nests. Quick, help put them back! Everyone always plays at the same time. The game consists of a number of Dori Rounds equal to the number of players, and then a final Round.

Dori Rounds

If you have the Dori marker, you will be Dori Dino for this Round. Everyone else plays against Dori as Dino Parents trying to save their Dino Eggs from Dori.



Are you playing Dori Dino?

Dori is a rascal and wants to roll the Dino Eggs **into the wrong nests** on purpose to create a multicolored mixture of colors.

Are you playing a Dino Parent?

The Dino Parents work together to roll the Dino Eggs **into the matching colored nests**. It doesn't matter in the Dori rounds which eggs you roll into the right nests.



Now everyone takes their Dino Wands in hand and begins play at the signal: „Dori, ready, go!“ Reminder: Please play fair even when things get rowdy. You may only roll the Dino Eggs using the tip of your Dino Wand and you may not interfere with other players. If a Dino Egg jumps out of the box, simply put it back in the middle.

Scoring a Dori Round

The Dori Round ends once all of the Dino Eggs have disappeared into the nests. Now, determine where the Dino Eggs have landed. Remove the gameboard and place it next to the box and place the Wreath in the middle. Then place all the Dino Eggs that are in the wrong nests inside the Wreath leaving the Dino Eggs in the correct nests in place. Then divide these Dino Eggs evenly between the Dino Parents, placing any left over Dino Eggs into the Wreath.



Once the Dino Eggs have been distributed, the little dinosaurs hatch! To do this, put your dino eggs back into the Wreath and take 1 Dinobaby counter for each dino egg you put back. The color of the counters doesn't matter. If there aren't enough Dinobaby counters, use a suitable replacement.

Example for 4 players: There are 15 Dino Eggs in the correct nests. Each of the 3 Dino Parents gains 5 Dino Baby counters. Dori never takes any Dino Baby counters.



Time for the next Dori Round! Return the gameboard to the insert with the Wreath in the middle and place all of the Dino Eggs in the middle of the Wreath. Give the Dori marker to the next player clockwise from the previous Dori.

When everyone has played Dori Dino once, play the final Round.

Final Round

In the final Round, you are all Dino Parents and no longer play as a team. **Now you are trying to roll the most Dino Eggs into your nests!** Your Dino Wand indicates the color of your Dino Eggs and nests. There are 2 nests of each color. Place the Dino Eggs back on the gameboard using the Wreath as usual, but remove any Dino Eggs of a color that is not being played.

Scoring the Final Round

Count how many Dino Eggs of the correct color each Dino Parent has in their nests and give them the corresponding number of Dino Baby counters. Then the game ends.

Game End

Whoever collected the most Dino Baby counters wins! If there is a tie for most, all tied players share the victory.

2-Player Game

There are 4 Dori Rounds with each player playing Dori twice. In the final Round, you each choose 2 colors instead of one.
